### Ford Chassis Specialist Diploma

The Ford Chassis Specialist Diploma program offers comprehensive training in diagnosing and testing core components such as steering, suspension, climate control systems, brakes, and new model updates. The curriculum includes advanced instruction in wheel alignment, electronic steering and suspension diagnostics, and troubleshooting both

manual and electronic climate control systems. Additionally, it covers techniques for diagnosing noise, vibration, and harshness (NVH) issues using tools like chassis ears and electronic vibration analyzers. The program also features three co-op experiences that provide practical, hands-on training at a Ford/Lincoln dealership.
